I hope to see you all at our next meeting on Mar 4th. Until then, may God bless you and your family and keep you safe.

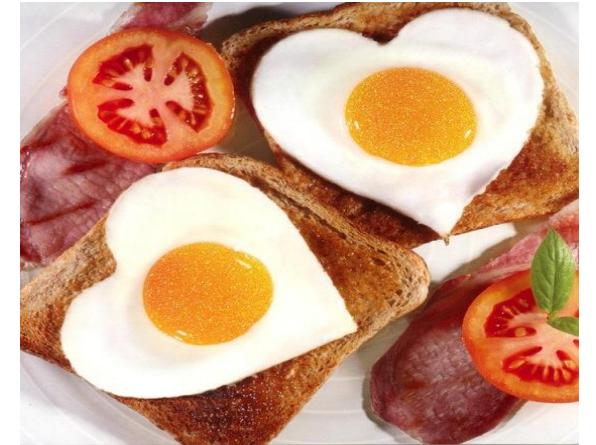
